## Family and Children First Council

FCFC is a group of local agencies and community organizations that work together as partners to improve the well-being of children and families in Jackson County. In 2021, the Jackson County FCFC served **82** Families.

Of those families:

- **42** Children had a Mental Health Diagnosis
- **37** Children had Special Education Needs
- **2** Children had Substantiated Child Abuse
- **22** Children had Substance Abuse Issues
- **6** Children had Substantiated Child Neglect
- **46** Children were below the poverty level
- **26** Children were found to be Unruly
- **19** Children were found to be Delinquent
- **16** Children were diagnosed with Autism Spectrum Disorder
- **4** Children did not have a Primary Care Dr.

## Emergency Preparedness

- The PHEP Grant develops and improves infrastructure to train, prepare for, and respond to emergencies and natural disasters.
- In 2021, the JCHD led Jackson County's response to the coronavirus pandemic (SARS-CoV-2). A great deal of time and effort on the behalf of the JCHD's staff went into this response, including PPE distribution, working with event planners on safety, performing contact tracing services, informing the community of pandemic-related updates, and immunizing Jackson Countians with coronavirus vaccines once they became available. The JCHD's many actions during the response to the coronavirus pandemic had a major impact on people's lives.
